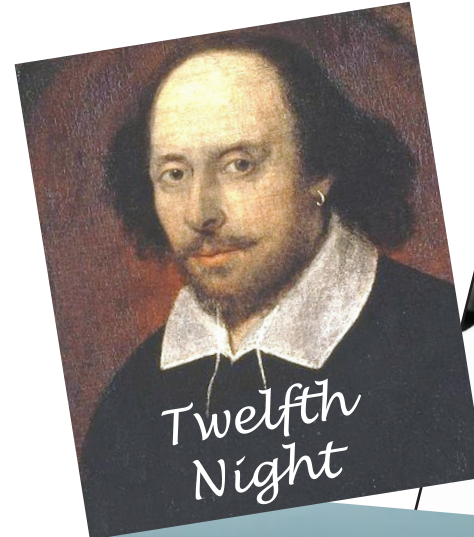

235 Second Avenue
(Corner of Second and Sand Street)

FROM ALBANY:

Take a hard left off Delaware onto Second Avenue. ACT is on the left past the third traffic light.

FROM I-787:

Proceed to the southern end of I-787 and go straight through the first intersection with a traffic light. Take a right at the next traffic light onto Second Avenue. ACT is on the left after one more light.

FROM DELMAR:

Take Delaware Avenue into Albany and a right onto Second Avenue. ACT is on the left after the third traffic light.

FROM THE THRUWAY:

Take Exit 23. Turn left on 9W to Hoffman Avenue. Take a right at the next traffic light at Second Avenue. ACT is on the left.

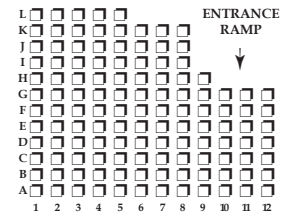

In October 1998, twenty-one-year-old Matthew Shepard was kidnapped, severely beaten and left to die, tied to a fence in the middle of the prairie outside Laramie, Wyoming - a victim of this assault because he was gay. Moisés Kaufman and fellow members of the Tectonic Theater Project made six trips to Laramie over the course of a year and a half in the aftermath of the beating and during the trial of the two young men accused of killing Shepard and conducted more than 200 interviews with the people of the town. *The Laramie Project* is a breathtaking theatrical collage that explores the depths to which humanity can sink and the heights of compassion of which we are capable.
